After a one year hiatus due to the pandemic, the 82nd Airborne Division Association will host its 75th National Convention over 11-15 August 2021, in Houston, TX. Bush Presidential Library and NASA's Houston Space Center.

All Chicago Chapter members are encouraged to attend the convention - it's a great opportunity to reconnect with the Airborne friends.


Association Education Fund

ABOUT THE CHICAGO CHAPTER

The Chicago Chapter is one of the three original chapters in the Association, officially organized as the Illinois State Chapter on 25 March 1946. On 15 April 1948, the Chapter reorganized to make room for more Illinois paratroopers and received its charter as the Chicago Chapter of the 82nd Airborne Division Association.

The 82nd Airborne Division Association was honored on 5 November 1990 by The United States Congress in receiving a Congressional Charter.

Today, the Chicago Chapter is nearly 200 members strong and active in social and service activities. The Chapter is managed by an Executive Board elected by chapter members and governed by our chapter By-Laws.

AIRBORNE HISTORY

WWII Victory Parade

On January 12th, 1946, the World War II Victory Parade was led by 13,000 men of the 82nd Airborne Division, including the African-American 555th Parachute Infantry Battalion. General James M. Gavin led the All Americans down Fifth Avenue in New York City as a grateful nation admired the U.S. Army's premier fighting unit. The parade also included Sherman tanks and other armored vehicles, such as self-propelled howitzers, and a fly-over by a formation of glider-towing C-47s.The 82nd also participated in the September Berlin Victory Parade of 1945.

In preparation for the New York festivities, the Division trained three times daily since late 1945, after having finished their garrison duty in Berlin. The Division arrived back in United States on January 3, 1946, aboard the HMS Queen Mary and continued training for the parade at Camp Shanks, NY.

The parade began at Washington Square, then proceeded up Fifth Avenue for four miles. It was a ticker tape parade. Government officials witnessing the parade included New York Governor Thomas E. Dewey, New York City Mayor William O'Dwyer, and former New York City Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia. New York was the site of the largest American Victory in Europe Day celebrations. One of our deceased Chicago Chapter members, Tony Vallos participated in this parade.
